COLD WEATHER ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL PROCEDURE

Students are permitted to enter the building at 7:45am. If the temperature is below 20 degrees, we will let students into the building starting at 7:30am. Our school day ends at 3:45pm each day during the regular semester. Students who are not attending another after school activity (Office Hours, detention, athletics, etc.) will be asked to leave the building by 4:00pm each day. Students will not be allowed to wait indoors for a ride. As the weather gets colder, please ensure your child has the appropriate winter weather clothing, including a coat, hat, and gloves and is prepared to wait for a ride outside.

PHONE POLICY


To maintain the sanctity of our learning environment, it is important that our school is a cellphone free zone between the hours of 8:00am and 3:45pm. For this reason, if any adult sees a phone visible during school hours, whether or not a student is actively using the phone, the phone will be confiscated and a parent will be required to pick up the phone from the main office. For this reason, students should keep their phones in their lockers or should leave their phone with a trusted adult (i.e. advisor, Dean of Students). As a parent, if you need to reach your child, we ask that you call our main office (414-837-4000) to communicate a message to your child instead of texting your child's phone directly as students should not have access to their phones during school hours and this puts your child at risk of having his or her phone confiscated.
